The following are items for discussion at the December 14, 2023 LUC Executive Committee Meeting.

### City of Urbana North Main Street Safety Study

The final memo for the North Main Street Safety Study has been reviewed and accepted by the study stakeholder team. The City of Urbana will use the recommendations in the study for safety improvements during their upcoming paving project. The final memo can be viewed in its entirety on the LUC website.

Staff is requesting that the LUC Executive Committee accept the study by adopting the attached resolution.

### City of Urbana Traffic Signal Study

Works has continued on the City of Urbana Traffic Signal Study. Data collection of turning movement volumes at several signalized intersections has been completed. B&N submitted signal warrant analysis for the intersections in the study. The City of Urbana has decided to reduce the scope of the project to focus primarily on their east west routes. This is due to the S. High Street construction project and its impact on traffic, particularly on the US 68 corridor. The City of Urbana would like to pursue the north south signal analysis in a couple of years when the S. High Street project is complete and traffic patterns normalize.

The next step in the study process is to begin the field review and condition assessment of those signals that are warranted and remain in the study. The complete study will allow the City of Urbana to identify a maintenance plan for their signal systems moving forward. The study is expected to be completed in early 2024.

### **FY24-25 Regional TIP Solicitation Cycle**

LUC will have an estimated \$626,320 to award in STBG capital funds through FY2025. TCC is soliciting eligible applications from communities in Champaign and Logan County that could utilize this funding through their development. Applications for the RTIP funding will be due January 19, 2024. 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



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











































DIAGRAM NORTH MAIN STREET PROPOSED CONDITIONS






CORRIDOR S DIAGRAM









Subject: N Main Street Traffic Safety Study

The goal of this study was to assess the existing pavement markings and signage and perform a crash analysis along N Main Street between Washington Avenue/Gwynne Street and Grimes Avenue (North) in Urbana, Ohio. ODOT is resurfacing this segment of N Main Street as part of the ODOT Urban Resurfacing Program. The striping changes and additional signage recommendations from this study will be included in the paving plans with the goal of mitigating crashes along N Main Street. Additionally, the intersection at Fyffe Street is being realigned as part of a separate planned project (PID #115978).

#### **Roadway Conditions**

N Main Street is classified as an urban other principal arterial with a 35 mph speed limit from Washington Avenue/Gwynne Street to Dellinger Road. North of Dellinger Road, the speed limit increases to 50 mph. Throughout the entire study area, N Main Street is a two-way, two-lane roadway with turn lanes at some key intersections. On-street parking is permitted for most of the corridor between Washington Avenue/Gwynne Street and Bloomfield Avenue. Sidewalks are provided on both sides of the roadway from Washington Avenue/Gwynne Street Bloomfield Avenue. There is intermittent sidewalk on the east side of N Main Street between Bloomfield Avenue and East Twain Avenue. Continuous sidewalks are provided on the west side of N Main Street from Bloomfield Avenue to West Twain Avenue with a few exceptions at commercial businesses where paved parking extends into the right-of-way.

Based on ODOT's Traffic Monitoring Management System (TMMS) the 2023 Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) volume on N Main Street between Boyce Street and Fyffe Street was 11,265 vehicles per day. 2023 TMMS data also shows an 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed of 32 mph with approximately six percent of vehicles traveling 35 mph or faster. Overall drivers are traveling below the posted speed limit. On-street parking is permitted for most of the corridor between Washington Avenue/Gwynne Street and Bloomfield Avenue on both sides if the roadway. Parking is prohibited between Bloomfield Avenue and Dellinger Road due to the number of commercial driveways.

From Washington Avenue/Gwynne Street to Bloomfield Avenue the area is mostly residential with several businesses scattered throughout, meaning there are many driveways for residential properties and commercial establishments. A half mile east of the corridor is a high school accessible from Washington Avenue and Boyce Street. From Bloomfield Avenue to Dellinger Road, the area is all commercial and industrial, featuring wide driveways on both sides of the

roadway. Past Dellinger Road, the area is residential east of the roadway with Grimes Field to the west of N Main Street. The existing conditions diagram showing current signage along N Main Street is provided in **Attachment A**.

#### **Crash Analysis**

Crash data from January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2022 was obtained for the N Main Street corridor from ODOT's GIS Crash Analysis Tool (GCAT) and analyzed using the Crash Analysis Module (CAM) Tool. The crash reports were reviewed to verify the location of each crash and crash type. A collision diagram that shows crash patterns by illustrating the approximate location of each reported crash is provided in **Attachment B**. The output for the corridor's CAM tool is provided in **Attachment C**.




Figure 1: N Main Street Crash Types by Severity Per Year

Along N Main Street there were 47 reported crashes with 17 percent resulting in injury, including one serious injury. No fatal crashes occurred during the study period. **Figure 1** shows the crash frequency on N Main Street by year and severity. Overall crash frequencies have remained steady over the three-year period.

**Figure 2** shows the total crashes along N Main Street by crash type. Rear end collisions were the most prevalent crash type (50 percent), three of which resulted in injury (7 percent). Fixed object and angle crashes were the next most-prevalent types, all of which occurred at various intersections and driveways along the corridor without a discernable pattern. The crash patterns along N Main Street are discussed in the following sections.






Figure 2: Total Crash Types Along N Main Street

#### **Locations for Improvement**

The existing conditions and potential improvements for each location along the corridor is detailed below. Detailed layouts of the potential improvements are shown in **Attachment D**. The corresponding page number for each location is included below.

## N Main Street from Washington Avenue/Gwynne Street to Lafayette Avenue (Page 1) Existing Conditions

- Of the 12 total crashes at the Washington Avenue/Gwynne Street intersection, six rear end crashes occurred three on each the northbound and southbound approaches.
- As evidenced by the faded pavement markings (**Photo 1**), vehicles are driving over the striped median, especially when there are vehicles parked along the roadway.
- The property on the northwest corner was previously a bank but is being redeveloped into a
  drive-thru coffee shop. With the redevelopment, more traffic may be accessing the
  property.
- Currently, parking is not prohibited near the intersection. When vehicles are parked here, the travel lanes become tighter and sideswipe crashes are more likely to occur.

• The speed limit sign for the southbound direction north of the intersection can be blocked by vehicles parked along the curb (**Photo 2**).

#### Potential Improvements

- Relocate the speed limit sign closer to the intersection along the segment where parking is prohibited.
- Delineate 23'x8' parking spaces along both curbs to separate the travel ways from on-street parking. Prohibit parking in both directions near the functional area of the intersection with Washington Avenue/Gwynne Street.
- Install a "no left turn" sign near the driveway to the new coffee shop to minimize the potential of angle crashes at this driveway.
- Reconfigure the lane widths at the Washington Avenue/Gwynne Street intersection to narrow the width of the median to prevent vehicles tracking through the painted area.



### N Main Street from Lafayette Avenue to Boyce Street (Pages 2-3) Existing Conditions

- There were no crashes reported in this segement during the three-year period.
- There is a wide, unmarked parking area on the west side of N Main Street between Lafayette Avenue and Lincoln Place.
- While no crashes were reported, there could be some confusion along N Main Street around Lincoln Place and Boyce Street since no centerline is striped.

#### Potential Improvements

- Maintain the edge line along the southbound travel way separating the wide, on-street parking area.
- Delineate on-street parking areas.
- Provide "No Parking" signage across from Lincoln Place to prohibit southbound parking along N Main Street in front of the gastropub.
- Provide dotted double yellow line to guide drivers through Lincoln Place and Boyce.

#### N Main Street & Fyffe Street/Laurel Oak Street (Page 3)

#### **Existing Conditions**

- There were no crashes reported in the three-year period.
- Semi-trucks were observed parking in this area to access Speedway (see Photo 3).

#### Potential Improvements

- The Fyffe Street realignment will be separate from the resurfacing project (PID #115978).
   The trail crossing improvement will be finished before the resurfacing occurs.
   Improvements include:
  - Fyffe Street and Laurel Oak Street will be redesigned to have one stop-controlled approach as an extension of Fyffe Street, omitting the current Laurel Oak Street approach.
  - The intersection will provide a pedestrian crosswalk across N Main Street for the bicycle trail, complete with yield lines, required pedestrian warning signage and rectangular rapid flashing beacons (RRFBs).
  - On-street parking will be provided on both sides of the roadway north of the new Fyffe Street intersection, which will be wide enough to accommodate semi-trucks.

#### N Main Street from Fyffe Street to Light Street (Pages 4-5)

#### **Existing Conditions**

- Two northbound rear-end crashes occurred under dry daylight conditions, both caused by vehicles failing to maintain assured clear distance to vehicles in front turning right into Speedway.
- Three southbound rear end crashes occurred in this segment. Two of the crashes occurred
  due to vehicles failing to maintain adequate distance behind vehicles waiting to turn left into
  Speedway.
- One non-injury angle crash occurred at Speedway's south driveway when a northbound vehicle collided into a left-turning vehicle leaving Speedway.

#### Potential Improvements

- Delineate parking along the west side of the roadway, with striped tapers at the Ultra-Met parking lot driveways to provide adequate sight distance while exiting the driveway.
- Install "No Parking" signage along the east side of N Main Street.
- Install a two-way left turn lane between the northern Speedway driveway and Light Street.

#### N Main Street & Light Street (Page 5)

#### Existing Conditions

• There were four northbound rear end crashes that occurred at this intersection during the three-year period.

#### Potential Improvements

- Provide northbound and southbound left-turn lanes within the existing roadway width.
- Delineate parking on the west side of the roadway to provide parking areas for residential properties in the area.



#### N Main Street from Light Street to Bloomfield Avenue (Pages 5-6)

#### **Existing Conditions**

- One parked vehicle crash occurred along this segment in the three-year period.
- Parking is prohibited on the east side of N Main Street across from Westview Drive.

#### Potential Improvements

• Delineate parking along both sides of the roadway where possible (outside of driveways and fire hydrants).

#### N Main Street & Bloomfield Avenue (Page 6)

#### **Existing Conditions**

- Three southbound rear end crashes occurred at this intersection involving vehicles turning left onto Bloomfield Avenue.
- There is a lot of left-turning truck traffic at Bloomfield Avenue destined to the grain elevator.

#### Potential Improvements

Provide a southbound left-turn lane within the existing roadway width.

#### N Main Street from Bloomfield Avenue to Dellinger Road (Pages 6-11)

#### **Existing Conditions**

- No discernable crash patterns occurred along this segment within the three-year period.
- There are a number of wide commercial driveways within this segment.
- When through traffic waits to turn left onto a business property, vehicles behind pass on the right. This increases the risk of rear ends and sideswipe crashes.

#### Potential Improvements

- Delineate a center two-way left turn lane along the entire segment to provide a space for left-turning vehicles to slow or stop outside of the through lane.
- Prohibit on-street parking along the entire segment.

#### N Main Street & Dellinger Road (Page 11)

#### **Existing Conditions**

- No intersection-related crashes ocurred during the study period.
- A Dollar General is being constructed on the northeast corner of the intersection.

#### Potential Improvements

- Maintain and shorten the northbound right-turn lane to accommodate the center two-way left-turn lane into White's Ford.
- Maintain single southbound lane through the intersection.

#### Dellinger Road to Mel Parshall Drive (North) (Pages 11-16)

#### **Existing Conditions**

- Five crashes occurred along this segment between 2020 and 2022 without discernible patterns.
- Some northbound vehicles turn left at Mel Parshall Drive (North) to access the Airport Café.

#### Potential Improvements

- Maintain the existing roadway configuration.
- If the roadway is reconstructed, consider installing a northbound left-turn lane at Mel Parshall Drive (North) into the airport.

#### **Cost Estimates**

Signing improvements identified as part of this resurfacing project were estimated to be \$17,000 in 2023 dollars. These costs are detailed in **Attachment E**. All other improvements are expected to be contained within the costs of resurfacing.
