

STOKES TOWNSHIP – INDIAN ISLES ZONING RESOLUTION ADDITION OF SECTION 1060 AND DEFINITION CHANGES

APPLICANT:	Stokes Township Zoning Commission 275 S. Oak St. Lakeview, OH 43331
REQUEST:	 Review proposed text amendments to the Indian Isles Zoning Resolution.
STAFF ANALYSIS (W.	 Dodds): Addition of Section 1060 Foundations - No building between 0 and 100 square feet shall be erected or located except on a foundation of gravel, cement or footers. No building greater than 100 square feet shall be erected or located except on a continuous foundation of cement. Any building or structure 200 square feet and over shall have a footer installed and inspected in accordance with county building regulations. When the Indian Isles Zoning Resolution was re-written and adopted in April 2010, the section regarding foundations was not carried over from the old resolution. Staff suggested to the Township that the issue of foundations should be left to the County Building Department. However, the township was concerned that some buildings less than 200 sq. ft. should be required to have foundations. The proposed regulation was drafted by the Zoning Commission. Change to definition "Building, Accessory" – A subordinate building, detached from, but located on the same lot as the principal building,



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the use of which is incidental and accessory to that of the main building or use. The accessory building may be partially opened or fully enclosed in which animals, chattels, or property are stored or kept.

- The Stokes Township Zoning Officer has met with the Logan County Prosecutor's Office regarding this definition, and this the language that the Prosecutor's Office has recommended, along with the removal of the definition for *"Storage Facility"* (see below).
- Removal of definition "Storage Facility" A structure which is partially opened or fully enclosed in which animals, chattels, or property are stored or kept.
 - This definition is being removed and combined with the definition for "*Building, Accessory*", per the recommendation of the Logan County Prosecutor's Office (see above).

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

 Staff attended the Stokes Township Zoning Commission meeting on October 25th 2010 when these changes were discussed. Given that staff has worked with the Zoning Commission, and the changes to the definitions are recommendations from the Logan County Prosecutor's Office, staff recommends *APPROVAL* of the proposed zoning text amendments to the Indian Isles Zoning Resolution.

ZONING & SUBDIVISION COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS:

- The Zoning and Subdivision Committee recommends *APPROVAL* of the proposed zoning text amendments to the Indian Isles Zoning Resolution in accordance with the staff analysis and the following comments from the committee:
 - The word "cement" should be replaced with the word "concrete" throughout Section 1060.
 - The word "footer" or "footers" should be replaced with "footing" or "footings" throughout Section 1060.

ZANE TOWNSHIP (LOGAN CO.) ZONING AMENDMENT – VARIOUS TEXT AMENDMENTS

APPLICANT:	Zane Township Zoning Commission
REQUEST:	 Approval of various text amendments to the Zane Township Zoning Resolution: Section 611 Action by Township Trustees (change) Section 1037 Small Wind Projects less than 5MW with subsequent Definitions (replace current Section 1037 Wind Power Generating Facilities) Section 1065 Family Care Home, Section 1066 Group Care Homes, Section 1067 Home for Adjustment, Section 1068 Institution (new sections for Residential Care Facilities with subsequent Definitions) Zane Township Official Schedule of District Regulations (various changes)
BACKGROUND:	Zane Township has been working over the last several months drafting these proposed amendments. LUC staff has been attending meetings with Zane Township regarding these proposed amendments.
STAFF ANALYSIS:	• DEFINITIONS – Staff has no problem with the changes and additions to the definitions section. These changes are directly related to the addition of the language for Small Wind Projects and Residential Care Facilities.



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- SECTION 611 This section has been updated to reflect the change in Ohio Revised Code 519.12 that requires only a *majority* vote of the Township Trustees to deny or modify the decision of the Zoning Commission. Staff has no problem with this change.
- SECTION 1037 This section is the addition of language for Small Wind Projects Less than 5MW. Zane Township had adopted language for large scale wind projects prior to the change in state law which gives authority to the OPSB/PUCO for systems 5MW and above. The Township Zoning Commission is using the LUC Model Language. The Township is proposing to allow Small Wind Projects as a permitted use in the U-1 Rural District, B-2 Local Business District, M-1 Light Manufacturing District, and I-1 Special Limited Industrial District and as a conditional use in the R-1 Low Density Residential District and R-2 Medium Density Residential District. Staff has no problems with the proposed language for Small Wind Projects Less than 5MW.
- SECTIONS 1065 1068 These sections are the addition of language for Family Care Homes, Group Care Homes, Homes for Adjustment, and Institutions. This language is taken from the LUC Model Text for Residential Care Facilities. This language has been previously approved for adoption by the Logan County Prosecutor's Office and the LUC Executive Committee. Staff has no problems regarding these sections.
- OFFICIAL SCHEDULE OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS The Official Schedule of District Regulations has been updated to include Small Wind and the Residential Care Facilities in the appropriate columns as permitted and conditional uses. The only other change is the removal of "Telecommunication Towers" as a conditional use in the U-1 Rural District to fall in line with state law that states cell towers can only be regulated in residential districts.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

• Staff recommends *APPROVAL* of the proposed zoning text amendments to the Zane Township Zoning Resolution based on the staff analysis and comments.



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ZONING & SUBDIVISION COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS:

- The Zoning and Subdivision recommends *APPROVAL* of the proposed text amendments to the Zane Township Zoning Resolution in accordance with the staff analysis and the following comments from the Committee:
 - The Committee feels that the township should address how Small Wind Projects Less than 5MW will be handled in the B-1 Service Business District.
