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Who is the Board of Trustees?

It's a three member board elected by the citizens of the township.

Two members are elected every four years.

One member is elected the two years after.

What Does the Board of Trustees Do?

The Board of Trustees has many duties and functions. In relation to zoning, the Board of Trustees performs limited functions.

Appointments come from the Board of Trustees. These include appointment of the Zoning Inspector, the Zoning Commission, and the Board of Zoning Appeals. The Board of Trustees may also appropriate moneys for the Zoning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals.

The Board of Trustees may initiate and/or review proposed amendments to the Zoning Resolution and adopts or denies said amendments.

The Board of Trustees establishes a schedule of fees and a collection procedure for zoning permits, amendments, appeals, variances, conditional use permits, plan approvals, and other matters pertaining to the administration of the Zoning Resolution.

Importantly, the Board of Trustees does not hear or decide questions of interpretation and enforcement that may arise. The Zoning Resolution requires all questions of interpretation and enforcement shall first be presented to the Zoning Inspector, and that such questions shall be presented to Board of Zoning Appeals only on appeal from the decision of the Zoning Inspector. Further recourse is provided through the court system.
